The Walker County Genealogical Society is proud to present professional genealogist and renown speaker Christopher D. Bryant on Saturday, Jan. 18, 2025.

Bryant will be speaking about “A Deep Look into African American History” which explores the different sources that can be utilized for researching African Americans. The focus will include census records, vital records, and the insights provided by DNA analysis.

Christopher Bryant is a professional genealogist, writer, editor, family heirloom preservationist, historian, lecturer/presenter, oral historian/interviewer, reunion planner, cemetery researcher, and transcriber. He is the owner and sole researcher of C.D. Bryant Genealogy as well as a member of the Association of Professional Genealogists and Dallas Genealogical Society.

He specializes in African American, Native American, and Hispanic history and culture while also analyzing DNA to assist in uncovering family mysteries. Along with these specialties, Bryant is an active volunteer for Find A Grave and a transcriber of new records

that are recently digitized.

He presents and lectures regularly for genealogy events, sharing various methods he uses to solve challenging genealogical problems as well as emphasizing the importance of documenting our history both fully and accurately.

Bryant has also been featured in major genealogical magazines such as *Family Tree Magazine*. The presentation will be at 10:30 a.m. in the Staggs Community Room of the Huntsville Public Library and is free and open to the public.
